# The Risen Christ

We spend our lives on our beautiful blue planet: our evolution takes us from childhood to adolescence, from learning to active participation, from the instant that we leave our parents' home and begin our own lives. The list is long.



What a beautiful passage from death to “Life” as Christ experienced! He opened the door to new pastures.

Yesterday, during the Easter vigil, many adults celebrated their Baptism, a rite of passage that signals a new start.
