### Vocation Corner Pentecost Sunday – B

**A Vocation View:** Be guided by the Holy Spirit, because with the Spirit comes, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. With God's help, come forward to proclaim to those who are searching for meaning in life. As the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

**Prayer:** That through union with the Blessed Virgin Mary, in whose company the Apostles received the Holy Spirit, men and women will receive the grace to respond to Christ's call to follow Him as priests, deacons and in the consecrated life, we pray to the Lord.

**Action:** IS JOY REALLY POSSIBLE? Many people ask themselves this question. The quest for joy can follow many paths, some even dangerous. How can we distinguish between the things that give real and lasting joy from those offering simply immediate and illusory pleasure? How can we find true joy in life, a joy that endures and does not forsake us at moments of difficulty?

**A message from Fr Jim Kaptein** - As you may have already heard, Kendrick Beler will be ordained in St. Joseph Parish in North Battleford, on July 11, at 7:00pm. As a way of showing our solidarity with him we are asking all parishes to provide a spiritual bouquet. People often ask, what does a new priest need the most? Invariably the answer is: Money, Books, Vestments or one of the latest electronic gadgets. But what he really needs is prayer - for it is the prayer of the people that will sustain him throughout his priesthood. To this end we are asking every parish to create a spiritual bouquet that can be part of an offering to Kendrick at his ordination. Some may be asking, "What is a Spiritual Bouquet?" Spiritual Bouquets are prayers or devotional acts that someone (the giver) has or will offer for someone else (the recipient). The idea is that each prayer is like a flower and combined prayers are a bouquet offered to the individual. It can be given from an individual or a parish to express joy and/or best wishes. The Vocations Commission suggests that a large card be made from heavy paper, perhaps with a bouquet of flowers on it, and or to see scripture. Along the sides should be the signatures of those pledging, along with action they are pledging; be it a Rosary, Holy Hour, Days of Fasting, Act of Charity, Special Novenas, or any other spiritual action. It is our hope that Kendrick will keep these bouquets close to his heart for the rest of his life.

# Diversity and Respect



Christians of the Pentecost are involved in our world. They are also aware that some ideologues and visionaries are in fact manipulators who may try to use religion for their purposes. However, they will not succeed.

Some political and religious leaders mistrust believers who, animated by the Holy Spirit, dare to speak up, disturb the status quo, and as Christ did, care for the poor, for those in need and without a voice. Members of this so-called “select” group would prefer a Church that is insulated, submissive, entirely devoted to other-worldly issues and not concerned with peoples’ daily lives.

During Christ’s time on earth, politicians and Pharisees were not able to restrict him, which is why they sentenced him to death. Christians of the Pentecost refused to be controlled or manipulated. Pope Francis, Jean Vanier, Mother Teresa and people around you do not practice a religion that separates faith from everyday life.

Christ’s disciples practice unity in diversity. Respect is a good fit. We are involved in people’s lives. Christians of the Pentecost do not distance themselves behind closed doors in order to escape the realities of life. We are called to open doors, go out into the streets, encounter people and work with the marginalized, just as Pope Francis has preached.

The Spirit also gives us the courage to take on new challenges: ... *for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline* (2 Tim 1:7).

We have been given a lifelong challenge: to change our hearts of stone into heart of flesh through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Each day brings its own issues. Our ability to respond will vary depending on our current stage of life and each requires a courageous response. Our faith journey is an evolutionary and involved process and not a calm river cruise.

Today, more than ever, our country experiences diversity with respect to language, color, and origin. It is a tapestry that displays our cultural and religious identities. We are united in faith through respect for each other. The feast of Pentecost, like the rainbow, is an event to celebrate.

We listen to Christ’s message in our own language. Two words to remember this week: *Diversity and Respect*.
