Vocation Corner Trinity Sunday – B

A Vocation View: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. When we go out to make disciples of all nations we have a lot to tell. God is Lord in heaven above and on earth below. Having received the Spirit that makes you God's own children, you are called to proclaim "Glory to the Father, to the Son and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was and who is to come." Alleluia!

Prayer: That the mystery of the love of the Blessed Trinity, manifest in the gift of Jesus Christ, will strengthen many men and women to respond to that love as priests, deacons and in the consecrated life, we pray to the Lord.

Action: Jesus' core message—that we are one—is surely one of the great mysteries of existence. This truth is so hard to accept because our senses tell a different story: We are separate, different, and alone. If you need an image to help us realize what our senses cannot; picture the giant redwood trees of California: They only grow in groves. Moreover, each tree's roots extend and grasp the roots of the surrounding trees, forming a strong, interconnecting network that serves to nourish and sustain all of them equally. Remember the redwood trees and their invisible, interlocking roots as you discern your vocation. You are not alone and never will be on your chosen path to Christ.

A message from Fr Jim Kaptein - As you may have already heard, Kendrick Beler will be ordained in St. Joseph Parish in North Battleford, on July 11, at 7:00pm. As a way of showing our solidarity with him we are asking all parishes to provide a spiritual bouquet. People often ask, what does a new priest need the most? Invariably the answer is: Money, Books, Vestments or one of the latest electronic gadgets. But what he really needs is prayer - for it is the prayer of the people that will sustain him throughout his priesthood. To this end we are asking every parish to create a spiritual bouquet that can be part of an offering to Kendrick at his ordination. Some may be asking, "What is a Spiritual Bouquet?" Spiritual Bouquets are prayers or devotional acts that someone (the giver) has or will offer for someone else (the recipient). The idea is that each prayer is like a flower and combined prayers are a bouquet offered to the individual. It can be given from an individual or a parish to express joy and/or best wishes. The Vocations Commission suggests that a large card be made from heavy paper, perhaps with a bouquet of flowers on it, and or to see scripture. Along the sides should be the signatures of those pledging, along with action they are pledging; be it a Rosary, Holy Hour, Days of Fasting, Act of Charity, Special Novenas, or any other spiritual action. It is our hope that Kendrick will keep these bouquets close to his heart for the rest of his life.

The Holy Spirit

Since Pentecost, Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit changed our concept of God, the Church, and of ourselves.

The relationship of God the Father and Christ, his Son, is reflected in *Another* with whom they are united. With the Holy Spirit, this relationship among the three Persons reflects their magnificence and complexity. They are three:

Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The essence of the Trinity is the open and loving relationship between three divine persons. We know this because love makes human relations alive and fruitful.

There is a beautiful expression from theologian Walter Kaspers, [President Emeritus, Pontifical Council of Promoting Christian Unity], "*in the Holy Spirit, who is God in us, we may know God above us, the Father, as the Son who is God among us*". (free translation)

The Church, without the Holy Spirit, would be inert, motionless or adrift. The Holy Spirit "*rejuvenates and renews it unceasingly*" as Vatican Council II reminds us.

Conformity may always exist in our lives. However, the Holy Spirit enables us to be flexible, free, and faithful. The Holy Spirit allows us the freedom to contemplate the mysteries of God, face a thousand challenges, and remain engaged, even though our endeavors may fail.

A stanza from the *Veni Creator (Come Holy Spirit)* mentions this Family whom we celebrate on the feast of the Trinity:

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow
the Father and the Son to know;
and Thee, through endless times confessed,
of both the eternal Spirit blest.
