Vocation Corner **Twenty - fourth Sunday of the Year – B**

A Vocation View: We do not advertise an easy life. But then no life worth living is an easy life. Jesus said: "If you wish to come after me, you must deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow in my steps." Pray for the gift of being able to accept your vocation

Prayer: That those called to give their lives for the sake of the Gospel as priests, deacons and in the consecrated life, will glory in the cross of Jesus Christ, we pray to the Lord.

Action: A painter and musician happened upon a spray-painted image of a cross on a walk along a Mexican road. He took a picture of what he saw: a haunting, rough, wild, desolate, but ultimately hopeful image of this universal Christian symbol. The man with the camera was simply out on a hike, but he has the discerning eye of an artist, so he sees things others might not. It is a talent cultivated over years of practice and a reminder to all of us to pay attention—for even the stones cry out the glory of God (cf. Luke: 19-40). Insights and sparks of enlightenment will come to us particularly through spiritual practice and prayer, and in those moments we will know above all else who we are and where we are being called.

Le 16 septembre - 24^e dimanche du temps ordinaire

September 16th – 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Douche froide! Il faut faire attention aux titres, car sous un même titre peuvent se cacher des programmes fort différents! Deux ou trois personnes peuvent aspirer au titre de « premier ministre du Canada ». Mais l'un peut avoir un programme favorable au monde des affaires et l'autre être plus axé sur les projets sociaux. Aux États-Unis, quarante-quatre personnes ont porté le même titre de « président des États-Unis », mais que de lignes d'action différentes! D'un côté, un Barack Obama qui soutient la lutte contre la pollution, de l'autre Donald Trump qui met en doute les causes humaines des changements climatiques.

À l'époque de Jésus, il en était de même. Un des titres les plus porteurs d'espoir était celui de Messie. Ce mot vient de l'hébreu : *mašîa*, qui signifie « celui qui a reçu l'onction royale » ou sacerdotale. La forme grecque du mot est *Christos*, qui a donné en français Christ. On peut donc dire que Christ est synonyme de roi. À compter du premier siècle avant Jésus Christ, ce titre est devenu porteur d'une immense espérance : le Roi-Messie serait envoyé par Dieu pour restaurer l'ancien royaume du roi David. Pour la majorité des Juifs, son programme incluait la levée d'une armée qui chasserait l'envahisseur romain et la purification du temple.

Étrange messie, étrange royaume

C'est ce programme que l'apôtre Pierre entrevoyait pour Jésus. D'une part, l'apôtre a raison de reconnaître en Jésus le Messie promis. D'autre part, il se trompe lourdement quant à son agenda. Jésus n'est pas venu restaurer le royaume politique du roi David, mais celui de Dieu! Or, devant l'opposition et l'hostilité des chefs religieux et politiques de son peuple, Jésus pressent déjà sa fin tragique: il sera rejeté et condamné à mort. Pierre tente alors de corriger Jésus, de lui dire en quelque sorte qu'il n'a rien compris au titre que lui, Pierre, vient de lui donner. Mais Jésus à son tour corrige Pierre : c'est lui Pierre qui n'a rien compris. Ce n'est pas à Jésus de marcher dans les idées de Pierre, mais c'est à Pierre de marcher selon la ligne d'action de Jésus. Un programme où le Messie ressemble davantage à un serviteur humble, dont le visage ne recevra pas l'huile royale, mais plutôt les crachats et les outrages de ses ennemis, comme l'avait entrevu le prophète Isaïe (53,1-3).

Finalement, ce n'est qu'après Pâques que les disciples comprendront vraiment le destin de Jésus et qu'ils accepteront son étonnant programme : révéler aux êtres humains la présence d'un Dieu-Père qui les aime, leur pardonne, les accueille, veut leur bonheur; rassembler tous les humains dans une famille dont la première loi sera le partage et l'amour mutuel.

À bien y penser, le programme de Jésus fait encore peur aujourd'hui... Seuls les coeurs remplis de son propre Esprit oseront le suivre dans le don de soi jusqu'au bout.
