## ***Vocation Corner*** *Twenty – ninth Sunday of the Year – B*

**A Vocation View:** Life's rewards are tied up in the spirit of service. Just as the Son of Man came to give His life, so too are we then called through our profession of faith to serve others. Lord, we pray, 'let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in You, to do your will.'

**Prayer:** For reverent boldness on the part of the faithful as they approach the throne of grace in prayer, asking the Lord of the Harvest for holy vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life, we pray to the Lord.

**Action:** When you go to church it may be hard to see beyond what the priests, deacons, lectors, cantors, and others are doing at the moment (unless of course you're one of those people!). Behind that hour of Mass, however, are many hours of meetings, practice, and personal preparation that go into leading worship. But the work everyone else in a faith community does—including yours—is just as important. Supporting yourself, and maybe a family, as well as all the other tasks of life, if you do them in a spirit of faith and generosity, go just as far in building the kingdom of God. And perhaps the most important thing you do is worship itself. The very origin of the word liturgy is the "public work and service" of the church.

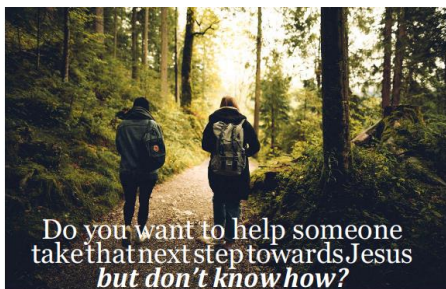

## Making Service our Priority



Since the world began, the quest for power has always been a major motivator for women and men. Who, in the depths of his or her heart, has not tried for a more prestigious position within the family, in the business world, in politics and even within the Christian community? Career paths are carefully plotted and individualism reigns supreme.

In the Gospel, we meet two interesting people: James and John. Zebedee's sons make an astonishing request to Jesus, who had chosen them to be his disciples. They asked him: *"Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory."*

Then Jesus explained his views on how true power should function. Unlike powerful people who exert great influence and claim privileges for themselves and colleagues, Jesus taught that selfless service would be the measure of success and greatness. He himself would provide the best example by giving up his life to save humanity. Jesus, our Saviour, humbled himself even going as far as to become a slave.

According to the Gospels, it is through serving others that one becomes powerful in God's eyes. Jesus taught that those who fight to ensure respect for others and for laws that are fair and just, are powerful. People who bring hope, support and sustain others are truly powerful in God's world.

To accomplish this, we must accept that suffering and rejection will undoubtedly hamper our way forward. We may also experience oppressive and invasive feelings of weakness and uselessness. This is what the Lord and his ambassadors, the prophet Isaiah and St. Paul, indicted would happen as people carried out their missions.

What great and incredible things could happen if the words power and service were synonymous!
