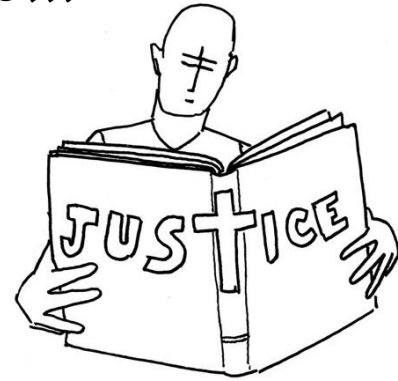

The Word is fulfilled...

That day, at the synagogue of Nazareth, an event took place that startled many people. When Jesus read Isaiah's text, that audience watched and listened to the very young person who had *come home*. When he finished, he issued a dramatic and astonishing statement: *Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.*



When Jesus rolled up the scroll with God's word and spoke, his audience did not recognize or accept his message. And yet, with these words, God's action and presence in our history was proclaimed.

During our own liturgical assemblies, are we able to recognize God's presence, not only in the proclaimed Word but also in our individual lives? Does God's Word circulate in our hearts as the Good News that challenges and even disturbs us enough to make us leave the comfort of our pews?

God's Word is fulfilled when it stimulates action from people who not only hear it but put it into practice.

Today, in order for the Word to be fulfilled, we have to do more than merely read the Gospels. What must happen is, with the inspiration of Holy Spirit, the Good News of the Gospel circulates, not only in churches and places of worship, but throughout the world where women and men are eager for integrity and compassion.

Today, as in the synagogue of Nazareth, in order for the proclamation of the God's Word to be meaningful and effective, it must be reflected in our attitudes, behaviors, viewpoints, and particularly in struggles for justice and the defense of human rights. Christians are only credible when the Gospel is visible in their lives. Then God's Word is fulfilled!
