Le diable en chacun de nous

Il est bien commode de se représenter le mal comme extérieur à nous. Le mal, ce sont les autres, les ennemis, les méchants. Regardez un enfant qui, marchant trop vite, se heurte sur un meuble et se fait mal. Il se retourne, regarde le meuble et, de rage, lui donne un bon coup de pied. Le message est clair : au lieu de s'en prendre à lui-même d'avoir heurté un objet déjà là, l'enfant se dit que c'est le meuble qui l'a frappé. En conséquence, il cherche à se venger.

Évoquant les tentations auxquelles Jésus a fait face, l'évangile présente ainsi un dialogue entre le diable et Jésus. Le diable est celui qui brise l'harmonie, l'unité. Il est le diviseur. Le récit évoque trois soifs qui déchirent notre âme et notre unité intérieure : le pain, le pouvoir, la magie. Chacun d'entre nous peut faire sa liste de tentations ou de divisions intérieures : à 15 ans, la drogue; à 20 ans, le succès; à 30 ans l'argent; à 40 ans le pouvoir, sans oublier les pulsions de la libido et le désir de vengeance. Le diable, c'est la force en nous qui divise notre être, notre unité intérieure, notre relation avec autrui, notre relation à Dieu, notre relation à l'environnement.

Comment y résister? En faisant des liens, en refusant cette déchirure et en rétablissant notre relation avec nous-mêmes, les autres, Dieu. À chaque tentation, Jésus répond en se référant à la Parole de Dieu. La Parole est dans ta bouche, dans ton cœur. La Parole est ce par quoi constamment Dieu se relie à nous. Elle est aussi ce qui nous rattache aux autres.

Ne laissez pas le diable en vous vous enfermer dans le silence pour déchirer votre être. Laissez circuler la Parole et le diable devient muet.
